



# **Alaska Notary Commission Process**

Step-by-Step Instructions to Begin My Notary Commission

# □ Step 1

I am eligible to become a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older
- Resident of Alaska for at least 30 days with the intent to remain indefinitely
- Legal resident of the U.S.
- Must be able to read and write English
- No felony convictions in 10 years
- Commission must not have been revoked in the last 10 years

## □ Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary bond, stamp and supplies at <u>NationalNotary.org/AK/Become</u> or I called 1-800-876-6827.

## □ Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

#### □ Step 4

I completed my commission application online through the <u>myAlaska portal</u> and uploaded my bond and notarized oath of office. If applying by mail, complete the <u>paper application</u>, and include all necessary documents and sent them to:

# □ Step 5

I have received my commission certificate from the state via email and/or mail.

#### □ Step 6

I have emailed or faxed a copy of my commission certificate with my NNA Customer ID number to: <u>Releasing@NationalNotary.org</u> or via fax to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.

NOTE: Any <u>Alaska Notary package</u> you purchase from the NNA will include your state required items: Notary bond and stamp. It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to become an Alaska Notary.
