



North Carolina Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Begin My Notary Commission

☐ Step 1

I am eligible to become a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older, or legally emancipated as defined in Article 35 of Chapter 7B of the General Statutes
- U.S. citizen or permanent resident alien
- NC Resident or nonresident with a regular place of work in NC
- Able to read, write, and speak English
- Have a high school diploma or equivalent
- Keep the most recent Notary manual approved by the Secretary of State
- No felony conviction in 10 years

☐ Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary seal and supplies at NationalNotary.org/NC/Become or I called 1-800-876-6827.

☐ Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

☐ Step 4

I have <u>scheduled</u> and completed my six-hour training at an authorized NC community college and passed the state exam.

☐ Step 5

I purchased my North Carolina Notary Public Manual at UNC School of Government bookstore.

☐ Step 6

I completed my <u>commission application</u>, had it notarized and included the following before mailing it:

- Included my up-to-date resume
- \$50 application fee
- Business card (If I have one)

☐ Step 7

I have mailed my commission application within 3 months of taking the notary course to:

☐ Step 8

I have received notification via email or mail to take my oath of office.

☐ Step 9

Within 45 days, I have taken my oath of office at the local office of the Register of Deeds, paid my fee for the oath and received my commission certificate.

□ Step 10

I scanned and email a copy of my commission certificate to Releasing@NationalNotary.org or faxed it to 1-800-833-1211 to have my Notary seal made. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.

NOTE: Any <u>North Carolina Notary package</u> you purchase from the NNA will include your state required items: Notary seal and NC fee schedule. It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to become a North Carolina Notary.
