



# **Alaska Notary Commission Process**

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

## ☐ Step 1

I am eligible to renew as a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older
- Resident of Alaska for at least 30 days with the intent to remain indefinitely
- Legal resident of the U.S.
- Must be able to read and write English
- No felony convictions in 10 years
- Commission must not have been revoked in the last 10 years

# ☐ Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary bond and supplies at <a href="NationalNotary.org/AK/Renew">NationalNotary.org/AK/Renew</a> or I called 1-800-876-6827.

#### ☐ Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

## ☐ Step 4

I completed my commission application online through the <a href="myAlaska portal">myAlaska portal</a> and uploaded my bond and notarized oath of office. If applying by mail, complete the <a href="paper application">paper application</a>, and include all necessary documents and sent them to:

#### ☐ Step 5

I have received my commission certificate from the state via email and/or mail (4-week turnaround).

### ☐ Step 6

I have emailed or faxed a copy of my commission certificate with my NNA Customer ID number to: <a href="mailto:Releasing@NationalNotary.org">Releasing@NationalNotary.org</a> or via fax to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.

NOTE: Any <u>Alaska Notary package</u> you purchase from the NNA will include your state required items: Notary bond and stamp. It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to renew as an Alaska Notary.
