



Colorado Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

☐ Step 1

I am eligible to renew as a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- Be 18 years or older
- Reside in Colorado
- Must be able to read/write English
- No felony convictions or misdemeanor involving dishonesty in five years
- No Notary commission revocation

☐ Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary seal and supplies at NationalNotary.org/CO/Renew or call 1-800-876-6827. The NNA® will immediately ship the supplies that are not dependent upon the commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc., as requested).

☐ Step 3

I completed my state-required training. The certificate of completion is only valid for 90 days.

Step 4

I have created an account and completed my state-required exam on the Secretary of State's website.

☐ Step 5

I downloaded the Affirmation form <u>here</u> and had it notarized by a current Notary with commission issued by the State of Colorado.

☐ Step 6

I have submitted my Notary application, along with the following:

- A copy of my ID card
- A state filing fee
- My course and exam certificates
- The original notarized affirmation

☐ Step 7

I received an email with my official commission certificate and my new Notary ID and password for online access.

☐ Step 8

I have emailed a copy of my commission certificate with my NNA Customer ID number to: Releasing@NationalNotary.org or via fax to 1-800-833-1211.

☐ Step 9

Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.





NOTE: Any <u>Colorado Notary package</u> you purchase from the NNA will include all of your state required items: Notary journal, and Notary stamp. It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to renew as a Colorado Notary.
