



Connecticut Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

☐ Step 1

I am eligible to renew as a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older
- Reside in CT, or nonresident working in CT
- No felony or other crime involving dishonesty, moral turpitude
- No previous commission revocation; no past notarial misconduct

NOTE: If you are renewing your commission, you must do so within 90 days of your expiration date, otherwise you must submit the application as a new Notary.

☐ Step 2

I purchased my Notary supplies at NationalNotary.org/CT/Renew or I called 1-800-876-6827.

☐ Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

☐ Step 4

I have received my renewal notice letter and PIN from the state either by mail or email, letting me know my commission is expiring.

NOTE: Letters are sent out approximately 90 days before your commission expires. If your commission has been expired for more than 90 days, you will need to request a reinstatement by emailing us at **bsd@ct.gov.**

Step 5

I submitted my application and fee at https://www.elicense.ct.gov/.

☐ Step 6

Within 30 days of receiving my certificate of appointment, I have recorded my oath and notary certificate with the town clerk.

□ Step 7

I have emailed or faxed a copy of my commission certificate with my NNA Customer ID number to: Releasing@NationalNotary.org or via fax to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.
