



Delaware Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

Step 1

I am eligible to become a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- **18 years or older**
- **Must be able to read and write English.**
- **Legal resident of DE, or a non-resident who maintains an office or regular place of employment in DE.**
- **Citizen or legal resident of the United States**
- **Must have reasonable need for commission**
- **Must be of good character and reputation; no felony convictions unless rights have been restored; no conviction involving dishonesty or moral turpitude**

Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary seal and supplies at [NationalNotary.org/DE/Renew](https://www.NationalNotary.org/DE/Renew) or called 1-800-876- 6827.

Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

Step 4

I have submitted my [Notary commission application](#).

Step 5

I have received my commission certificate from the state.

Step 6

I have signed and taken my oath of office before a Notary Public. I have emailed a copy of my notarized oath to the Secretary of State at notary@delaware.gov before performing any notarial act.

Step 7

I have emailed or faxed a copy of my commission certificate with my NNA Customer ID number to Releasing@NationalNotary.org or via fax to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.

NOTE: Any [Delaware Notary package](#) you purchase from the NNA will include your state required items: Notary stamp and journal . It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to renew as a Delaware Notary.
