



Kentucky Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

☐ Step 1

I am eligible to renew as a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older
- U.S. citizen or permanent legal resident
- Resident of Kansas or have a place of employment or practice in the county where the application is made
- Be able to read and write English
- Not be disqualified to receive a commission under KRS 423.395.

☐ Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary bond and supplies at NationalNotary.org/KY/Renew or I called 1-800-876-6827.

☐ Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

☐ Step 4

I printed and completed my commission application and sent it to:

☐ Step 5

I have received an email from the Secretary of State's office approving my application. The email includes instructions on the next steps, which involve obtaining a Notary bond and taking the Oath of Office.

☐ Step 6

I have forwarded my email notice to the NNA to issue my bond: <u>Releasing@NationalNotary.org</u> or called 1-800-876-6827. The bond will be sent via email.

☐ Step 7

Within 30 days, I have gone to the county clerk's office (listed in my email) taken my Oath of Office, posted my bond, and recorded my appointment date.

☐ Step 8

I have emailed or faxed a copy of my commission certificate with my NNA Customer ID number to: Releasing@NationalNotary.org or via fax to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.





NOTE: Any <u>Kentucky Notary package</u> you purchase from the NNA will include your state required item: Notary bond. It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to renew as a Kentucky Notary.
