



Montana Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

☐ Step 1

I am eligible to renew as a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older
- A citizen or permanent legal resident of the United States
- A resident of or have a place of employment or practice in MT; or spouse or legal dependent of military personnel assigned to active duty in MT
- Able to read and write English

☐ Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary bond, seal and supplies at NationalNotary.org/MT/Renew or I called 1-800-876-6827.

☐ Step 3

I have completed my 4-hour state-required training and passed the exam.

Step 4

I have provided my county to the NNA so they can issue my bond.

☐ Step 5

I have taken and passed the Montana Notary exam.

☐ Step 6

I have received my bond via email and taken it to a notary. They will administer my oath of office and notarize my signature. (My name and signature on the bond and application are an exact match.)

☐ Step 7

I have completed my <u>Notary commission application</u> online, paid my \$25 filing fee and uploaded the following:

- Training certificates of completion
- Exam certificate
- Notarized surety bond form with your oath of office

☐ Step 8

I have received my commission certificate and copy of Montana Notary Public Handbook from the state.





☐ Step 9

I have emailed or faxed a copy of my commission certificate with my NNA Customer ID number to: Releasing@NationalNotary.org or via fax to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.

NOTE: Any Montana Notary package you purchase from the NNA will include your state required items: Notary education, bond, stamp, journal and fee schedule. It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to renew as a Montana Notary
