



New Hampshire Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

□ Step 1

I am eligible to renew as a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older, or legally emancipated
- NH resident
- Read, write and understand English
- Am endorsed by two NH Notaries and one registered voter
- Certain convictions may be disqualifying

Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary seal and supplies at <u>NationalNotary.org/NH/Renew</u> or I called 1-800-876-6827.

□ Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

□ Step 4

I completed my <u>commission renewal application</u>, which was sent to me by the state 12 weeks prior to my commission expiration date, and notarized "Criminal Record Release Authorization" form and sent both to:

Step 5

I have received my commission, oath of office, and Notary Public Manual state.

□ Step 6

I have had my oath of office and commission notarized by two Notaries or two Justices of the Peace, or one of each.

Step 7

I have sent my oath of office to the Secretary of State.

Step 8

I have received my Commission Certificate for Notary Public from the state.

□ Step 9

I have emailed a copy of my commission certificate to the NNA: <u>Releasing@NationalNotary.org</u>, or faxed to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.





NOTE: Any <u>New Hampshire Notary package</u> you purchase from the NNA will include your state required item: Notary stamp. It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to renew as a New Hampshire Notary.
