



Rhode Island Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

☐ Step 1

I am eligible to become a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older
- Citizen or permanent legal resident of the U.S.
- A resident of or have a place of employment or practice in Rhode Island
- Read and write English
- Demonstrate enough knowledge of Notary Public powers and duties
- Not be disqualified for a commission under RIGL 42-30.1-16

☐ Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary seal and supplies at <u>NationalNotary.org/RI/Renew</u> or I called 1-800-876-6827.

☐ Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

☐ Step 4

I completed the Notary Knowledge assessment.

☐ Step 5

I took my Oath of Office on the application and had it notarized.

☐ Step 6

I completed my Notary commission application and sent it with the \$80 fee to:

Notary Public Section 148 W. River Street Providence, RI 02904-2615

☐ Step 7

I have received my commission certificate from the state.
