



South Carolina Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

□ Step 1

I am eligible to renew as a Notary and am in compliance with state requirements:

- 18 years or older
- Be a resident of South Carolina
- A registered voter
- Read and write English
- Not be under a court order declaring mental incompetence
- No felony convictions, or offense against election laws or, if previously convicted, have served a full sentence or received a pardon

□ Step 2

I purchased my state-required Notary seal and supplies at <u>NationalNotary.org/SC/Renew</u> or I called 1-800-876-6827.

□ Step 3

I have received the supplies that are not dependent upon my commission (e.g. journal, law primer, etc.).

□ Step 4

I completed my <u>Notary commission application</u>, had it notarized, and sent it to my County Delegation office (counties listed on application instructions) along with the \$25 application fee.

□ Step 5

I have received my commission certificate from the state.

□ Step 6

I have emailed a copy of my commission certificate to <u>Releasing@NationalNotary.org</u> or faxed a copy to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.

Step 7

Within 15 days, I have registered my commission with the local county clerk.

NOTE: Any <u>South Carolina Notary package</u> you purchase from the NNA will include your state required item: Notary stamp. It's the best and most convenient way to make sure you have everything you need to renew as a South Carolina Notary.
