



Vermont Notary Commission Process

Step-by-Step Instructions to Renew My Notary Commission

☐ Step 1

I am eligible to become a Notary and am in compliance with the minimum qualifications:

- 18 years or older
- A VT resident, or have a place of employment or practice in VT
- Be a citizen or permanent legal resident of the U.S.

☐ Step 2

I have completed my state-approved continuing education training.

Renewal Exceptions: (Per Notary FAQs on State Website)

- Those notaries public who are exempt from the continuing education requirement under Vermont law (a list of notaries public who are exempt from the continuing education requirement can be found here); and
- Those notaries public who obtained a notary public commission within the last two years (on or after February 1, 2021).

☐ Step 3

I have completed my <u>Notary commission application</u> online and paid the non-refundable application fee.

☐ Step 4

I have received my commission certificate from the state.

☐ Step 5

I ordered any Notary supplies that I want at <u>NationalNotary.org/VT/Renew</u> or I called 1-800-876-6827.

☐ Step 6

If I ordered a stamp, I have emailed a copy of my commission certificate to Releasing@NationalNotary.org, or faxed it to 1-800-833-1211. Once my documents have been received, my stamp will be shipped within 3-5 business days.

The NNA is a national provider of Notary supplies, training, bonds, and insurance. Your Vermont Notary commission is issued through the Secretary of State's Office of Professional Regulation.
