

New Mexico Remote Online Notary Commission Process

Step-by-step instructions on how to become a Remote Online Notary in New Mexico.

1. Be a Commissioned New Mexico Notary

Before applying to become a New Mexico RON, you must be commissioned as a traditional Notary Public in the state of New Mexico.

2. Complete a RON Training Course and Receive Proof of Completion

You'll need to take a [state-approved RON training course](#) and pass the included exam with a score of 80% or higher to receive a certificate of completion.

3. Choose a State-Approved RON Technology Provider

To perform remote notarizations, you'll need to choose a [RON technology provider](#) that meets New Mexico state requirements for virtual notarizations.

4. Obtain your Digital Certificate, Electronic Seal, and Electronic Journal

You'll need a digital certificate, electronic seal, and electronic journal that's compatible with the RON technology system you decide to use. These digital supplies may be included with your RON system.

5. Submit Your Application to the Secretary of State and Wait for Approval

Once you're ready, submit your completed [RON application](#), course certificate of completion, and \$75 application fee to the New Mexico Secretary of State.

6. Provide Proof of Your Notary Stamp Before the Deadline

Within 45 days of your application being approved, provide proof of your Notary stamp by submitting a [stamp registration form](#) to the Secretary of State.
